## Proof of Age or Disability for 2005 and 2006 Must Be Submitted With Application

Age 65 or Older. If you (or your spouse) indicated at Line $4 a \operatorname{and} /$ or $4 b$ that you were 65 or older, you must submit proof of age with your application. Examples of acceptable documentation include copies of the following:

- Birth Certificate
- Driver's License
- Church Records

Receiving Federal Social Security Disability Benefits. If you (or your spouse) were under 65 and indicated at Lines 4a and/or 4b that you (or your spouse) were receiving Federal Social Security Disability Benefits, you must submit with your application a copy of the Social Security Award Letter indicating that you (or your spouse) were receiving benefits for that year(s) based on your own social security number.
